Dogfish Head – Limited Releases

Festina Peche, Berliner Weiss

8% ABV

\$6 / 12 oz. Bottle

A refreshing neo-BerlinerWeisse fermented with honest-to-goodness peaches to 4.5% ABV. Sadly there are only two breweries left in Berlin still brewing the BerlinerWeisse style which is characterized by its intense tartness. BerlinerWeisse is traditionally fermented with lactic cultures to produce its acidic or green-apple like character. Its delicately hopped with a pale straw color and served as a summertime quencher. Since the natural sugars are eaten by the yeast, the fruit complexity is woven both into the aroma and the taste of the beer. - DFH

Black and Blue, Fruit Beer

10 % ABV

Golden Belgian Ale made with over 300 lbs of fresh blackberries and blueberries. With a deep purple full body and a long-lasting lacy pink head, this ale is both attractive and delicious! Belgian yeast gives this brew a characteristically dry spicy finish. The beautiful interplay of fruit, spice, and alcohol is complimented by a soft malt profile, and a high level of carbonation. - DFH

Immort Ale

11% ABV

Vast in character, luscious & complex. Brewed with peat-smoked barley, this strong ale is brewed with organic juniper berries, vanilla & maple syrup. Aged in oak. - DFH

Palo Santo Marron

12% ABV

This beer is a 12% abv, highly roasty, and malty brown ale aged on the wood of the Palo Santo tree from Paraguay. Palo Santo means "holy tree" and its wood has been used in South American wine-making communities. We were lucky enough to get our hands on 20 blocks of the super-dense wood. - DFH

Burton Baton

10% ABV

A blend of oak-aged English strong ale and our 90 Minute I.P.A.. Citrus notes from Northwestern hops meld with vanilla notes from the oak.

Red and White

10% ABV

\$25 / 750 ml Bottle

A big, Belgian style Wit brewed with coriander and orange peel and fermented with Pinot Noir juice. After fermentation a fraction of the batch is aged in Pinot Noir barrels, another fraction is aged on oak staves. The beer is blended before packaging. A successful marriage of citrus and the robust complexity of a bold red wine. - DFH

Midas Touch Golden Elixir

9% ABV

Our recipe showcases the ingredients of barley, white Muscat grapes, honey & saffron found in the drinking vessels in King Midas' tomb! Somewhere between a beer, wine and mead, this smooth, dry ale will please with Chardonnay or I.P.A. drinker alike.

120 Minute IPA

18% ABV

Brewed to a colossal 45°P, boiled for a full 2 hours while being continually hopped with high alpha American hops, dry-hopped every day in the fermenter for a month, and aged for a month on whole leaf hops, 120 Minute IPA is by far the strongest IPA ever brewed.

Scaldis Prestige, Biere de Champagne, Belgium, 13 % ABV

Pours hazy thick golden amber with much sediment floating around. Aroma is very alcoholic and oakey with hints of banana. Aging in oak barrels for 6 months gives this beer uncommon richness.

Rogue Chipotle Ale, Flavored Ale, Oregon, 5.5% ABV

Dedicated to Spanish author Juan de la Cueva, who, in 1575, wrote of a Mexican dish that combined seedless chipotles with beer: Chipotle Ale is based on Rogue's Oregon Golden Ale, but delicately spiced with smoked chipotle chile peppers. Deep golden in color with a tight head, rich malty aroma, delicately smooth and crisp flavor, and subtle chipotle chili finish.

Curieux , Barrel Aged, Maine, 10.5 % ABV

To make the Curieux (French for "curious"), we age our Tripel Ale in Jim Beam barrels for 8 weeks in our cellar. During the aging process in bourbon barrels, the beer is totally transformed, and many new flavors and aromas develop. Most notably, the beer picks up soft coconut and vanilla characteristics...and also a hint of bourbon flavor!

Dupont Avec Les Bons Voeux, Saison ,Belgium, 9.5%

"With Good Vows". Fruity farmhouse that is malty and doughy. Crispy and mildy vinuous, tingly at start with a mellow finish.

Sam Adams Chocolate Bock , Massachussetts, 5.6% ABV

Samuel Adams partnered Felchlin, a renowned Swiss chocolatier, to develop a unique innovation, Samuel Adams Chocolate Bock. After using a centuries old brewing process, called Krausening, we slowly aged the beer on a bed of rare dark cocoa nibs from Felchlin, a renowned Swiss chocolatier. Known for their quality these wild cocoa nibs, harvested from the rainforest of Northern Bolivia, impart complex aromas and flavors of chocolate, honey and vanilla in the beer. The resulting beer, Samuel Adams Chocolate Bock, has a big, malty character that is combined with the subtle sweetness of chocolate, giving this brew a complex full-body taste with a velvety finish.

Schlenkerla Rauchbier, Smoked Lager, Germany, 6.2% ABV

Its smoky flavor is being achieved by exposing the malt to the intense, aromatic smoke of burning beech-wood logs at the Schlenkerla-maltings. After mixing it with premium-class hops in the brew, it matures in 700 year old cellars, deep down in the hills of Bamberg, into a mellow, magnificent-tasting beer.

Fantome Noel, Saison, Belgium, 10% ABV

Reportedly spiced with honey, caramel, coriander, black pepper, and other secret ingredients. The alcohol content probably goes a long way toward explaining that very warm and satisfied feeling one finds on the very first sip. A rich, dark-flavored beer with lots of deep-roasted chocolate malt, but still fairly dry, with a hint of sourness at the core. It is very spicy, with some winter spruce flavor in the bargain.

Chouffe Houblon Double IPA Tripel, Belgium, 9.5% ABV

A unique marriage between the English tradition of IPAs, the new American revolution of Imperial IPAs and the classic Belgian way of brewing. Houblon Chouffe, although very much hopped as it is, showcases the unique balance between a very strong IPA and a very special Belgian Tripel exclusively created for this ale (Big malty body, distinct dryness, expressive estery fruitiness).

Great Divide Oak Aged Yeti, Imperial Stout, Colorado, 9.5% ABV

Aging on a blend of French and toasted oak chips infuses a subtle oak and vanilla character into Yeti's already intense chocolate, roasted coffee malt flavor and hugely assertive hop profile.

La Divine de St Landelin has fruity, woody and caramel aromas as well as a certain bitterness persistent upon the palate. Its smooth and delicate taste can be discovered throughout your tasting. This beer can be filed under the "Extremely Drinkable" heading, as it is very easy to palate while still offering a delicious complexity.

Brooklyn Brewery Local 1, New York, 9% ABV

Behind the full golden color you'll find an alluring aroma, a dynamic complex of flavors, Belgian flair, Brooklyn fortitude and a dusting of our special yeast. To create this beer, we use the old technique of 100% bottle re-fermentation, a practice now rare even in Europe. It gives this beer a palate of unusual depth.

Gouden Carolus Hopsinjoor, Belgian IPA, Belgium, 8% ABV

Hazy gold, huge lumpy loosely knit white head. Smells like tropical fruit, orange, peach, flowers, grass, earth, pungent black pepper, fresh and good. Great balance between moderate sweetness and clean grassy bitterness. Long bittersweet hoppy fruity spicy finish, with a bit of tartness. ***This is a style that has gained in popularity since the release of the Chouffe Houblon, which blew the Belgian IPA idea up.***

Hugh Malone, Double IPA Tripel, Maine, 8.5% ABV

Hugh Malone Ale's base includes English two-row malt and pale crystal malts, establishing an understated sweetness. To give Hugh Malone its hop character we use generous portions of Simcoe hops at three points in the brewing process. To begin with, we use a technique referred to as first wort hopping, in which Simcoe is added to the sweet wort as it enters the kettle. When the wort comes to a boil in the kettle we add Warrior hops, adding another layer to the bitterness of the beer. Later in the brewing process we steep a large amount of Simcoe in the whirlpool to impart a distinct hop aroma. Finally, during secondary fermentation in our conditioning tanks, we dry hop the beer, which instills a hoppy aroma with notes of pine and grapefruit.

Harvey's Le Coq Imperial Extra Double Stout, England, 9 % ABV

Ola Dubh Old Ale, England, 8 % ABV

Ola Dubh (or 'Black Oil') is a collaboration between Harviestoun Brewery and Highland Park, Distiller of the Year. This deliciously rich, dark, 8% a.b.v. beer is the first ale to be aged in malt whisky casks from a named distillery and, with traceable casks and numbered bottles, the rest with genuine provenance. Ola Dubh is, in the words of beer aficionado Owen D.L. Barstow: "The most interesting new British beer I have tried in years."

Samichlaus Helles, Doppelbock, Austria, 14 % ABV

Vintage 2007

One of the rarest beers in the world, brewed only once a year on December 6th, subsequently fermented and matured for about 10 months before bottling in October. Thus Samichlaus is a vintage beer and with around 14 % of alcohol by volume the strongest bottom-fermented lager in the world. Samichlaus may be aged in the bottle for many years to come. Older vintages become more complex with a creamy warming finish.

Super-caramelly and oak aged. Very heavy malt. The oak is apparent in this high gravity ale, adding additional depth and complexity with a woody, cask-like nose and a pronounced vanilla on the palate.

FOUR, Belgian Style Quadrupel, Maine, 10 % ABV

Vintage 2007

Brewed with four malts, four hops, four sugars, and four yeast strains. Date sugar is added to the mash tun during fermentation, followed by candy sugar, dark sugar, and light golden molasses. Cellar refermentation in the bottle with final yeast strain.

Thomas Hardy's, England, 11.7 % ABV

Scarce, subtle and complex, Thomas Hardy's Ale is the beer enthusiast's equivalent of rare cognac. Bottle-conditioned to mature in the bottle, this old ale/barley wine will improve with age for at least 26 years. Not for the faint of palate, especially when young and brash, maturity brings an elegance of flavors unmatched by any other beer—if you have the patience to cellar it for at least a decade.

Allagash Musette, Maine, 10 % ABV

Vintage 2006

Our interpretation of a Belgian-inspired Scotch ale, Musette undergoes a caramelization process in the kettle, where the first runnings are condensed and caramelized, imparting a unique and subtle caramel character and amber color to the beer. Following fermentation with a Belgian strain of yeast, a portion of it is aged in oak bourbon barrels for an additional three months. Musette offers up raisin, ripened banana, and hints of licorice aromas. Its taste is malty and caramel with a hint of roast, and its warm finish strikes a balance between dry and caramel characters with a hint of smoke.

Le Baladin Xyauyu, Barleywine, Italy, 13.5 % ABV

Brewing Process: The wort is hyperconcentrated then boiled for two and a half hours. Primary fermentation for 25 days in steel vessels. Using the solera method, tasting from 6 to 24 months later (depending on oxidation velocity), the brewers decide when it is time to bottle. ONLY 2000 BOTTLES WERE SENT TO THE UNITED STATES!

Aged in wooden casks for 20 months, including Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Whiskey, then grappa. The final version is blended from different casks to ensure balance.
